Cost of living

In terms of living expenses, it is difficult to predict how much money you will need. To give you an idea of average monthly expenses, here is a rough budget:

Housing	DKK 3000-4000 (€ 400-535)
Food	DKK 1500-2000 (€ 200-270)
Transportation	DKK 300-1100 (€ 40-150) – depending on whether you live on campus or in the city
Books	DKK 450-600 (€ 60-80)

In total you should expect to use approximately DKK 8,000 per month, but it depends on your personal standards and requirements.
